The Heptasophs.

NEW ORLEANS, April 12.—The morning session of the Supreme Conclave of Heptasophs or the S. W. M. was occupied entirely with the Maryland question. It was finally decided in favor of the Grand Encampment, now in existence, organized by G. V. Metzger in March last. The afternoon session was devoted to the election of officers, who serve for two years. They are as follows: Wm. E. Foster, of Virginia, Supreme Archon; E. Heidingsfelder, of Louisiana, Supreme Chancellor; F. M. Spencer, of Texas, Supreme Provost; James H. Livingston, of Maryland, Supreme Secretary; Geo. S. Hubbard, of Virginia, Supreme Treasurer; Alexander Dimitry, of Louisiana, Supreme Prelate; H. C. Mayer, of Texas; Supreme Inspector General; E. R. Boehler, of Louisiana, Supreme Herald; James M. Black, of Virginia, Supreme Guide; Peter Jenson, of Texas, Supreme Warden; John Ortner, of Ohio, Supreme Sentinel; Wm. MacWilliams, of Maryland, James R. Chansey, of Pennsylvania, and George V. Walkley, of New Jersey, Trustees. After the election of officers the conclave went into secret session, and at 6 p. m. adjourned until to-morrow.
