PROF. DIMITRY.

His Lecture at the Arlington Club.

"EARTH'S FITNESS FOR MAN."

There was a very refined and intelligent audience at the Arlington Club rooms, on Thursday night, to listen to the lecture of the distinguished scholar, Prof. Alexander Dimitry, of New Orleans. It was not generally known that the lecture would take place at the time indicated, and many who desired to hear the distinguished statesman were deprived of the pleasure, because of the uncertainty as to time when the lecture was actually to occur.

Prof. Dimitry was laboring under a severe cold, and his voice was not so strong as to permit him to speak at any great length.
