Sailed from New York on Friday, ship Six Brothers, capt. Lee, for Marseilles. Passengers, N. H. Carter, of New York; Dr. Philip H. Thomas, and Major John E. Lewis, of Milton, N. C. and Joseph Stephanini, the young Greek, whose unhappy circumstances lately excited among many of our fellow citizens so much commiseration. He is supplied with money which he hopes may prove sufficient to ransom his mother and four of her children from Turkish captivity. He left here deeply impressed with gratitude to his numerous friends and benefactors, and with a request that an expression may be made of his feelings. By the sale of two editions of a brief narrative of himself, he has realized about fourteen hundred dollars, with which he proceeds to Marseilles in the ship Six Brothers, Capt. Lee, who had before showed much kindness, having offered him on very liberal terms accommodation on board of his vessel.—*American.*
