## **Dr. A. C. Zenos Wills \$15,000 to Widow, Grandson**

Mrs. Maud Jewell Dick, widow of Elmer E. Dick, former office machine manufacturer, left an estate of \$135,000, it was disclosed yesterday when her will was admitted to probate before Judge John F. O'Connell. Mrs. Dick died on Jan. 19 at the age of 74.

She bequeathed \$5,000 to a nephew, Frank L. Kriete Jr., of 2300 Park place, Evanston, and \$5,000 each to three grandchildren. The residue was left to her son, Elmer J. Dick, of 1070 Westmore road, Winnetka, father of the three children.

Also admitted to probate was the will of Dr. Andrew C. Zenos, dean emeritus of the Presbyterian Theological Seminary, who died on Jan. 25. He left an estate of \$15,000. Dr. Zenos, who was secretary of the Chicago Presbytery for 25 years, left his widow, Mrs. Ruth Zenos, of 834 Chalmers place, \$10,000. To a grandson, Z. McPherson Linnell, 16, of 852 Chalmers place, was left \$5,000 in trust until he shall become of age, when he will receive the principal.
