Col. Knox Given Degree at Lake Forest College

Three honorary degrees were conferred by Lake Forest college today at commencement exercises which closed the fifty-eighth year of the school. Forty students were graduated at the exercises, held on the south campus.

Frank Knox, publisher of The Daily News, who gave the commencement day address, was awarded the honorary degree of doctor of laws. The honorary degree of doctor of science was conferred upon Charles Thom of Washington, D. C., and the degree of doctor of literature was awarded to Andrew C. Zenos, professor of Biblical theology at the Presbyterian Theological seminary, Chicago.

Seniors in Procession.

Observance of commencement day was started with a breakfast given by President Herbert McComb Moore and Mrs. Moore to many of the alumni. The graduation

ceremonies began with the traditional procession of seniors from Durand auditorium to the south campus in front of the college library.

Following the ceremonies a buffet luncheon was served in the commons at which Col. and Mrs. Knox were the guests of President and Mrs. Moore.

Life in Abnormal Times.

Col. Knox, in his address, told the students that they have not yet experienced life under normal American conditions. During their infancy, he said, the nation was at war and then followed a hectic period of postwar prosperity and a national mania for gambling in securities.

Then came the depression, he pointed out, and three years ago "the American people, bitter and disillusioned, discouraged by the
